Effective Dec. 1, 2016, new regulations issued by the US Department of Labor change the current threshold regarding



which employees qualify for overtime pay and which are exempt. Under the rule changes, to maintain exempt status, employee's weekly wage must be at least \$913 per week, an increase from the current limit of \$455. The seminar will explore the new rules on salary tests and their impact on businesses and non-profit organizations.

A second topic, focusing on the new Massachusetts Equal Pay Act, effective July 1, 2018, will



require significant changes in pay practices by Massachusetts companies. The act requires equal pay for equal work introducing the concept of comparable worth when setting pay.
